Dear Sir/Madam,

WHEREAS, Online Application/Scheme No. NMC/UGI/2026-2027/0069 was submitted to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board (MARB), National Medical Commission (NMC), seeking increase in annual intake of 100 MBBS seats (from 150 to 250) in "Lord Buddha Koshi Medical College & Hospital, Saharsa (Bihar) for the Academic Year 2026–27;

2. WHEREAS, Section 28(2) of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 mandates that every applicant shall submit a scheme to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board in such form and containing such particulars as may be prescribed under the relevant regulations. Further, the proviso to Regulation 9 of the Establishment of Medical Institutions, Assessment and Rating Regulations, 2023 provides that an incomplete application, including one not accompanied by the mandatory documents prescribed under the Regulations, is liable to be rejected;

3. WHEREAS, Section 29 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 read with Regulation 11 of the Establishment of Medical Institutions, Assessment and Rating Regulations, 2023, requires the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, while considering a scheme under Section 28, to assess, inter alia, the adequacy of financial resources, availability of academic faculty, hospital facilities, infrastructure, and such other prescribed criteria necessary for the proper functioning of the proposed medical college;

4. WHEREAS, the Public Notice dated 22.12.2025 inviting applications for the Academic Year 2026-27 specifically stipulates that:

"The regulatory framework does not contemplate a 'work-in-progress' status at the time of application; rather, it obligates readiness and demonstrable compliance ab initio. Therefore, any plea of being in the process of completing infrastructure or requesting additional time defeats the very objective of the scheme under the Act and Regulations and is wholly impermissible."

5. WHEREAS, upon scrutiny of the application under Section 29 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, read with Regulations 11 and 12 of the Establishment of Medical Institutions, Assessment and Rating Regulations, 2023, and the Public Notice dated 22.12.2025, the following deficiencies were observed and communicated to the applicant through Show Cause Notice dated 05.06.2026:

	CoA	There is deviation in the name of affiliated University in the COA submitted by College . In the NMC records, college is affiliated with B.N. Mandal University. whereas the CoA submitted by the college along the application has mentioned of the name of the University as Bihar University of Health Sciences.

6. WHEREAS, the applicant institution was afforded an opportunity under Section 28(3) of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, read with Regulation 13 of the Establishment of Medical Institutions, Assessment and Rating Regulations, 2023, vide Show Cause Notice dated 05.06.2026, to rectify the aforesaid deficiencies and submit a compliance report within **seven (07) working days**;

7. WHEREAS, the applicant institution submitted its compliance report on 15.06.2026, along with the documents furnished in support of its response to the Show Cause Notice. The compliance submitted by the applicant was duly examined by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board (MARB);

8. WHEREAS, Section 28(7) of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 empowers the Medical Assessment and Rating Board (MARB) to conduct the evaluation and assessment/inspection of any medical institution at any time, either directly or through experts having integrity and experience in the medical profession, **without any prior notice**. Accordingly, MARB conducted an inspection of the institution through duly appointed assessors, and the assessment report submitted by the assessors was examined by the Expert Committee constituted by MARB before making its recommendations.

9. WHEREAS, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board (MARB), National Medical Commission (NMC), after examining the application, the assessment report, the recommendations of the Expert Committee, the compliance submitted by the applicant institution, and all other relevant records in accordance with the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, the Undergraduate Medical Education Standards Regulations (UGMSR), 2023, the Establishment of Medical Institutions, Assessment and Rating Regulations, 2023, and the Public Notice inviting

applications for the Academic Year 2026–27, **has decided to approve the scheme and grant a Letter of Permission (LoP) under Section 28(3) of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019. During such examination, the following observations were noted. The institution shall rectify the same and ensure continued compliance with the provisions of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 and the regulations framed thereunder.**

As per assessor report- 4.1% faculty deficiency. 2.08% SR/tutor/demonstrator deficiency.

10. WHEREAS, after due consideration of the application, the assessment report, the recommendations of the Expert Committee, and the observations recorded above, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board (MARB), in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 28(3) of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, **hereby grants** permission for increase of annual intake of 50 MBBS seats from 150 seats to 200 seats to "Lord Buddha Koshi Medical College & Hospital", Saharsa, Bihar for the Academic Year 2026–27, subject to the provisions of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, the regulations framed thereunder, and the terms and conditions specified herein.

Terms and Conditions

I. The applicant and the institution shall be solely responsible for ensuring continued compliance with the provisions of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, the regulations framed thereunder, and all directions, guidelines, advisories, and public notices issued by the National Medical Commission (NMC) from time to time. The institution shall maintain, throughout the academic year, the prescribed standards relating to physical infrastructure, hospital infrastructure, human resources, teaching faculty, clinical material, equipment, and all other statutory requirements.

II. If, at any stage, it is found that this Letter of Permission has been obtained on the basis of any false declaration, misrepresentation, suppression of material facts, or submission of fabricated or forged documents, or if such misconduct comes to the notice of the National Medical Commission during a physical or virtual assessment, surprise inspection, or otherwise, MARB shall be at liberty to withdraw, cancel, or revoke this Letter of Permission. In addition, the institution shall be liable for such action as may be permissible under the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, including denial or withdrawal of recognition of the medical

qualification and any other action deemed appropriate under law.

III. The medical college and its attached teaching hospital shall comply with all applicable statutory requirements, including those relating to **building safety, occupancy, fire safety, pollution control, environmental protection, biomedical waste management, radiation safety**, and all other approvals, licences, and clearances required under the applicable laws.

IV. The institution shall comply with the seat-sharing requirements applicable in accordance with the policies and directions issued by the Government of India, National Medical Commission, and the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) from time to time.

V. The medical college shall develop and maintain an official website containing updated information regarding the institution, including:

- a. courses offered and sanctioned intake;
- b. teaching faculty and their qualifications and experience;
- c. student admissions;
- d. affiliating university;
- e. hospital services and facilities;
- f. departmental infrastructure and equipment;
- g. OPD and IPD statistics; and
- h. Birth and death records maintained under the applicable laws.

VI. The institution shall comply with the following additional conditions:

- a.** MARB reserves the right to withdraw, cancel, or revoke this Letter of Permission if it is found that the permission has been obtained by fraud, misrepresentation, suppression of material facts, or submission of false or fabricated documents.
- b.** MARB reserves the right to conduct physical and/or virtual assessments, including surprise inspections, at any stage and to take appropriate action based on the findings thereof.
- c.** The institution shall strictly comply with all the conditions stipulated in this Letter of Permission. MARB shall have the right to call for any information or conduct such an enquiry as may be necessary to verify compliance with these conditions in both letter and spirit.
- d.** MARB may take appropriate regulatory action against the institution for failure to maintain the standards prescribed by the Undergraduate Medical Education Board (UGMEB) or the Postgraduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB), as the case may be, including issuance of warning, imposition of monetary penalty, reduction of intake capacity, stoppage of admissions, or recommendation to the Commission for withdrawal of recognition, in accordance with the National Medical Commission Act, 2019, and the regulations framed thereunder.
- e.** The institution shall furnish all admission-related information within the timelines prescribed by the National Medical Commission from time to time.

Failure to submit such information within the stipulated period shall be treated as non-compliance with the statutory requirements governing admissions and may invite appropriate action under the National Medical Commission Act, 2019.

f. The medical college shall install, maintain, and ensure the continuous functioning of the Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS), Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) surveillance system, Hospital Management Information System (HMIS), and such other information technology systems as may be prescribed by the National Medical Commission from time to time. The data generated by these systems shall be made available to the National Medical Commission whenever required.

g. The institution shall rectify all deficiencies, if any, observed during future assessments within the period specified by MARB. Failure to do so may result in the refusal of renewal of permission or initiation of appropriate regulatory action, including withdrawal or revocation of this Letter of Permission, in accordance with the provisions of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019.

VII. This Letter of Permission shall not be construed as a waiver of any statutory requirement or obligation under any applicable law. The institution shall obtain and maintain all approvals, licences, certificates, and permissions required under the applicable Central, State, and local laws throughout its operation.

11. The National Medical Commission (NMC) has received *E-Bank Guarantee No 87GT02262010012 dated 7th August 2026 for Rs.05Cr.(Five Crores) valid for a period of six years*, towards increase of annual intake of 50 MBBS seats (from 150 to 200 seats), in compliance with the stipulation contained in the Public Notice dated 14.07.2026 regarding the MBBS seat matrix for the Academic Year 2026–27.
